3. BUILDING PROJECTS

ALHAMDULILLAH, EFFORT IN THE VAST NORTHERN CAPE IS ONGOING. THE NORTHERN CAPE MAKES UP APPROXIMATELY 30% OF THE TOTAL AREA OF SOUTH AFRICA. THUS TRAVELLING FROM ONE POINT TO ANOTHER IS FAIRLY CHALLENGING, HOWEVER MUCH PROGRESS HAS BEEN MADE IN THE PAST YEAR ALHAMDULILLAH.

COMPLETED PROJECTS 2023/2024

IMAM'S HOUSE, MASJID HAMZA RADHIALLAHUANHU, VICTORIA WEST

Alhamdulillah the building of this Masjid was completed in November 2021. The Imam was initially staying off-site. The need arose for us to build him quarters on the Masjid premises. This project was completed in February 2025. Victoria West is 350km away from Kimberley.



MASJID BIBI AA'ISHAH RADHIALLAHU ANHA, LOBATSI STREET, GALESHEWE, KIMBERLEY

Alhamdulillah the first Masjid in the township of Galeshewe, Kimberley, was opened in November 2023. The minaret was completed thereafter as well alhamdulillah. The Old Salaah Khana is now used permanently for the Madrassah.

MASJID MUHAMMAD MUSTAFA ﷺ, KOFFIEFONTEIN

Alhamdulillah the Masjid in Koffiefontein was opened in February 2024. There is a Madrassah running as well. Musallee attendance is excellent, alhamdulillah. Koffiefontein is a mining town 100 km away from Kimberley in the Free State province, bordering the Northern Cape.



MUSALLAH MU'AZ BIN JABAL RADHIALLAHU ANHU, RITCHIE

A few years ago, a container Musallah was donated to us from the Masjid Jamaat of Germiston. Alhamdulillah this was placed in the small town of Ritchie, 50km away from Kimberley. Extensive renovation and extension work took place, as well as the construction of a new wudhu khana, kitchen and toilets. The Imam's house was also renovated. This Musallah officially opened in February 2024.

MASJID ABU UBAYDAH BIN JARRAH RADHIALLAHU ANHU, JAGGERSFONTEIN

The masjid was opened alhamdulillah in 2023.

Jaggersfontein is a small former mining town situated 161km away from Kimberley

TOWN SALAAH KHANA, BOSHOF

Alhamdulillah the second Salaah Khana in Boshof, that is in the center of town, was opened in April 2024.

MASJID SA'EED BIN ZAYD RADHIALLAHU ANHU, BRITSTOWN

We purchased a church in Britstown,
situated on the N12 to Cape Town,
at a distance of 225km from Kimberley.

The church was converted into a beautiful Masjid
and opened towards the end of 2023 alhamdulillah.



C U R R E N T P R O J E C T S

DEALSEVILLE MASJID

The Building of this Masjid is nearing completion alhamdulillah. Dealesville is situated 108km from Kimberley on the old Bloemfontein Road.

RENOVATION PROJECTS

Major renovation work took place at several of our centres. Some of the more noteworthy ones are listed below:

4. BURSARIES

Sponsoring of students in various local Madrasahs, for travelling, and other needs. In some cases, clothing and/or meals are also seen to. Miftahuddin also sponsors some local studying in various Darul Uloom and Institutes of Learning. Miftahuddin Islamic Institute extended aid towards some underprivileged towards their respective secular course of choice.

5. RUNNING OF HOSTELS

1. Madrassah Ta`līmul Banaat Hostel

2. Madrassah Islamiyyah Revert Adult Ladies Hostel (Islamic Center, Mint Village)

6. RAMADHAAN FEEDING SCHEME

Sehri, Iftâr, Supper and Eid clothing arrangements for the underprivileged, as well as for the inmates at the two prisons.

7. QURBANI FEEDING SCHEME

A Mini-Mina Qurbani Camp organised where slaughtering, feeding and distribution of meat takes place at one place collectively for the poor. Approximately 3000 people are fed on the days of Eidul-Adha.

8. GHURABA WAL MASAKEEN WABNIS-SABEEL

Assistance to the poor, orphans, travellers, funeral arrangements and matrimonial assistance.

9. PRISON

Miftahuddin also runs the Muslim Prison Board Northern Cape branch.

Amongst the activities are: Rendering assistance to the inmates in education, Rehabilitation, Halaal food, Sehri, Iftaar, Taraweeh, Eid projects, Jumu'ah, Supplying of literature, Islamic cassettes and CDs, and other needs. Particular mention should be made of Eid days, where special arrangements are made for the inmates to celebrate the days of Eid.

10. ISLAMIC MUSEUM

The Darul 'Ajaib Islamic Museum has been established by Miftahuddin with the purpose of reviving a spirit of appreciation within the new generation youth, and in the long term as a source of Da'wat to non Muslim guests.
